PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCE (P.T.C.) AND STUDENT-LED CONFERENCE (S.L.C.)**GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS**

The following guidelines are expected to be observed by all parents/guardians during Parent-Teacher Conferences (P.T.C.s) and Student-Led Conferences (S.L.C.s). These guidelines hope to put more order in the way conferences are done between and among students, parents, and teachers. Everyone's cooperation is expected so that this effective tool for home-school collaboration can be maximized.

1. The P.T.C. and S.L.C. shall begin at exactly 8:00 a.m. and will run until 4:30 p.m.

It is the policy of the school not to release Report Cards before the scheduled date nor before 8:00 a.m. of the scheduled date. Report Cards that are not claimed on the scheduled date and time will have to be claimed from the Registrar's Office.

2. Conferences are held in the classroom of your child and it is facilitated by your child's Homeroom Adviser.

Please make sure that you know your child's Grade Level and Section and the name of his/her Homeroom Adviser before going to the school.

3. Report Cards shall be released following a set schedule determined by the Registrar and the Head of Student Services and approved by the Principal. Upon arriving in school, all parents/guardians are expected to proceed to the classroom of their child.

For 5th to 12th Grade Students, report cards shall be released after the Student-Led Conference participated in by the student, the parent/s, and the Homeroom Adviser. Parents will be informed of their set schedule at least a week before the schedule date of the P.T.C. and/or S.L.C.

4. In the interest of time, each parent/guardian will be allotted a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes of conferencing. For 5th to 12th Grade students, the first 7.5 minutes will be spent for the Student-Led Conference while the remaining 7.5 minutes will be for the conference between the parent/s and the Homeroom Adviser.

We encourage parents/guardians to keep the conference short but substantial by focusing on the most important areas that need to be discussed. Homeroom Advisers will focus the conference on your child's strengths, areas for improvement, and the formation of resolutions that will be observed to address gaps. Should there be a need for a longer time for conferencing, parents/guardians are to set another appointment with the Homeroom Adviser on another date. Appointment forms shall be made available at the Office of the Head of Student Services.

Student-Led Conferences are to be participated-in by the students, parents, and the Homeroom Adviser. The flow of the conference is directed by the student and monitored by the Homeroom Adviser. The parent listens to the child as he/she discusses his/her Portfolio Journey for the term focusing on his/her strengths, area/s for improvement, challenges, and plans for the succeeding terms.

Students from the 5th to 12th Grades are expected to come with their parents during the P.T.C. to take the lead in the Student-Led Conferences.

The usual conference between the parent and the Homeroom Adviser will happen in the event a student will not be available for the Student-Led Conference. It is highly encouraged however, that parents do their best to bring the child with them during the P.T.C. and/or S.L.C.

After the S.L.C., a parent fills-out a short questionnaire to assess the effectiveness of their child in doing the conference. This is being done for feedback purposes only and will not have any academic credit whatsoever.

- Subject Teachers and Management Officers who are not Homeroom Advisers are also available for conferencing on a first-come-first-served basis. The subject teachers shall be staying in the Main Hall while the Management Officers shall be in their respective offices. They will be on hand to discuss your child's performance and/or any of your concerns from 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.**

You may proceed to them before or after your scheduled P.T.C. and/or S.L.C.

- All Report Cards will only be given to parents/guardians.**


Parents/guardians who will authorize other persons to collect the report card will have to submit a letter of request/authorization to the Principal but subject to confirmation and approval. Report Cards will not be given to students.

- The original copy of the Report Card shall only be given to parents/guardians who do not have any outstanding balance in the accounting office.**

All outstanding balances have to be settled first before the original copy of the report card is given. Otherwise, an unsigned photocopy shall be issued.


Parents/guardians with outstanding balance will have to claim the photocopy of the report card from the Registrar's Office.

Report Cards will never be turned over to students and/or their older siblings. P.T.C.s and/or S.L.C.s may still take place even if there are unpaid outstanding balances.

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PARENTING CORNER

3 Strategies to Involve Parents in Children's Education

Learning doesn't end in the classroom, yet most parents are at a loss when it comes to supporting their children's intellectual development. Many try to do too well and hover around them when they do homework, which can stifle creativity and self-development. Others let them roam free and hardly monitor their progress.

Yet, studies are unanimous. Children are more successful at school when parents are involved. Better yet, teachers, too, are positively affected when parents take interest. That's because involved parents promote positive classroom behavior, make sure children do their homework, help them be more organized, enforce disciplinary measures, and validate their effort.

The following are the key strategies to involve parents more in their children's education:

- 1. Help your child get the best out of school.** Try to give encouragement and show appreciation of your child's achievements, whether great or small, as this can help boost their confidence. Teach them basic organisation and time management skills so they are not overwhelmed with projects or homework. Be realistic and avoid putting your child under pressure by having over-high expectations.
- 2. Give your child out of school support.** Often parents like to introduce a variety of interests in and out of school too so children have the opportunity to explore other interests that they enjoy. Learn together, do things together, visit interesting places, talk about things you've seen on television and encourage your child to ask questions. When a child comes home from school, they may be tired so try not to fire too many questions of your child as soon as they walk through the door. They may be tired or hungry and not feel like talking. Be available to listen later if they want to talk.
- 3. Develop a consistent partnership with the school.** Young people live and learn in two worlds – home and school. The way the two connect and communicate can make an enormous difference to how children learn to manage in both places. If teachers, parents and young people all trust, listen and talk to each other, the final goal of helping children learn and develop to their best ability is most likely to be achieved.
