FROM THE SCHOOL REGISTRAR

REMINDER ON ABSENCES. According to the Department of Education Manual of Regulations for Private Schools, **students with absences reaching 20%, which is 40 days, of the total number of school days shall be automatically dropped from the roll without the benefit of an appeal and without refund of fees paid regardless whether the absences are excused or unexcused.**

Parents are advised to apply a Leave of Absences at the Principal's Office if the child will be absent for more than 5 consecutive school days, a week before the said date. An Academic Undertaking will be signed by the student and the parents once the Leave of Absence is approved.

Habitual absences may necessitate the retention of a student on the same level at the end of the school year. Those who have incurred absences regardless of the reason are held responsible for all school work missed during their absence.

REQUESTING AND RELEASING OF ACADEMIC SCHOOL RECORDS. As per DepEd Order no. 48 s. 2017, request for **all Academic School Records** shall be filed and claimed by any of the following, subject to the presentation of a valid proof of affinity to the minor learner as stated below:

Parent – Birth Certificate of the minor learner

Brother or Sister of legal age - Birth Certificate of the minor learner and the brother or sister

Legal Guardian – court order

In case a request shall be filed by a representative, the person shall be duly authorized in writing through a valid Special Power of Attorney (SPA) duly executed by the applicant specifically stating the name of the representative and the purpose of its issuance.
